Grant of conditional permission to Govt. Gurukul Ayurved College, Gurukul Kangari, Haridwar-249404, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID:- AYU0239) for intake capacity with 50 seats (62 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) and 12 seats (15 Seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely- (i) Panchakarma-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (ii) Kayachikitsa - 03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (iii) Shalya Tantra - 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Shalakya Tantra- 02 seats (Without EWS) (v) Kaumarbhritya- 02 seats (Without EWS) for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 -regarding.

### Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- 1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Govt. Gurukul Ayurved College, Gurukul Kangari, Haridwar-249404, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID:- AYU0239), inspection of your college was conducted on 04.03.2024 and 05.03.2024 on hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) and 12 seats (15 Seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely- (i) Panchakarma-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (ii) Kayachikitsa 03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (iii) Shalya Tantra 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Shalakya Tantra-02 seats (Without EWS) (v) Kaumarbhritya- 02 seats (Without EWS) for the academic session 2024-25, under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations there under.
- 2. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

#### 1) Teaching Pharmacy:-

a) Quality testing lab is not available.

Dr. Saurabh Singh Yadav (AYSV00925) - Asst. Professor in Swasthvritha department	Not Submitted in Part-1 but was present on the day of visitation and added in annexure as <b>Asst. Professor in the department of Swasthvritha</b> . After verification in the OTMS, application for appointment has not been raised by the college. <b>So cannot be considered and faculty is an excess faculty.</b>
Dr. Shahjbee (AYPS00496) – Asst. Professor in Prasuti Tantra Department	Not Submitted in Part-1 but was present on the day of visitation and added in annexure as <b>Asst. Professor in the department of Prasuti Tantra</b> . After verification in the OTMS, application is withheld and restoring form has not been filled by the faculty. <b>So cannot be considered</b> .

- 5) Functionality of the hospital:
  - a) Computerized central registration system is not available.
  - b) Average bed occupancy percentage is 42%. (Shortcoming of 8%).
  - c) There was zero delivery conducted from 1st Jan 2023 to 31st Dec 2023.
- 6) Central research Laboratory & Animal House is not available.
- 7) Observation by the visitors
  - a) Computerized central patient management system is not functioning at the time of visitation and managing by manual entries.
  - b) Not maintained the registers of labour room.
  - c) Department of Rog Nidana is not having sufficient number of equipment.
  - d) Fire safety and pollution control certificates were not available.
  - e) Swab register, immunization register not available.
- 3. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the 95<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 28.06.2024. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 04.07.2024 to appear on 09.07.2024 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the conditional permission to your college with 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) and 12 seats (15 Seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely- (i) Panchakarma-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (ii) Kayachikitsa 03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (iii) Shalya Tantra 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Shalakya Tantra- 02 seats (Without EWS) (v) Kaumarbhritya- 02 seats (Without EWS) for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied.
- 4. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter. no. 910/3তসাত/2024-25 dated 08.07.2024 against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Hearing was attended by Dr. Bipin Kumar Pandey, principal and Dr. Sunil Kumar Gupta, Medical Superintendent appeared before the Hearing Committee on 09.07.2024 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

- The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under, and the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **97**th **Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 12.07.2024.**
- 6. Whereas, in view of the aforementioned shortcoming and deficiencies and as per the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and it is found that the college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course as per regulation 3(3) of MSR-2016 under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020. However, Board decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the academic session 2024-25.
  As per the seat reduction policy
  - a) "For every 10% deficiency in Hospital staff, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat."

Accordingly as per Schedule–IV Note (5) of MSR 2016 for conditional permission, minimum eighty percent of above hospital staff shall be required. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 97<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only 69.3% of Hospital staff and there is **shortcoming of 10.7% in Hospital staff** which is rounded off to 10%. Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2024-25, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing one seat of the total intake capacity.

b) In case of non availability of computerized central registration system seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat.

There is non-availability of computerized central registration system. Therefore, in accordance of seat Reduction policy 2024-2025, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake seat strength by **one seat.** 

c) For every one percent deficiency in Bed occupancy, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat.

As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 97<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of MARBISM, the average bed occupancy percentage of the college is only 42% and there is **shortcoming of 8%.** Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2024-25, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing eight seats of the total intake capacity.

Therefore, after applying the seat Reduction Policy, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 50 seats (62 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

7. Therefore, in view of the shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, conditional permission is granted to Govt. Gurukul Ayurved College, Gurukul Kangari, Haridwar-249404, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID:- AYU0239) with 50 seats (62 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)] and 12 seats (15 Seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely- (i) Panchakarma-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (ii) Kayachikitsa - 03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (iii) Shalya Tantra - 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Shalakya Tantra- 02 seats (Without EWS) (v) Kaumarbhritya- 02 seats (Without EWS) for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under.

- (i) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of with 50 seats (62 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)] and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 12 seats (15 Seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as. designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- 8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2025-26:
  - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder.
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
  - iv) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016.
  - The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 4 [(2),(3),(4),(5) and (7)].
- The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
