Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Govt. Gurukul Ayurved College, Gurukul Kangari, Haridwar-249404, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0239) inspection was conducted on 08.04.2025 and 09.04.2025 on hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 12 seats (15 Seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Panchakarma-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (ii) Kayachikitsa-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (iii) Shalakya Tantra-02 seats (Without EWS), (v) Kaumarbhritya-02 seats (Without EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects were observed:-

1. Teaching staffs:-

a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college and visitor observation is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} x 100\% = \frac{26}{30} x 100\% = 86.66\%$ (Excluding Excess).

- a) There is shortcoming of 4.85% of Average bed occupancy against the minimum requirement of 50 % (Available 45.15%).
- b) There were 0 deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2024 to 31st Dec 2024. Labour room is non-functional.
- 5. Mean of general and essential equipment's/instruments is 75.82%.
- 6. Observation by the Visitors:-
- a) All the OPD are working regularly except Agad OPD and Screening OPD which is shown zero.
- b) NO HIMS software or any other computerized system is maintained by hospital.

7. Application along with document to continue post graduate programme in Shalakya Tantra either with Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) or Shalakya-Karna, Naasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino-Laryngology) or continue with both programs from the academic session 2025-26.

- Accordingly, the aforementioned shortcoming/defects found in the assessment report was informed to you vide letter of even no. dated 29.05.2025. In response of the same you have submitted the clarification vide an email dated 03.06.2025 enclosing a letter vide Letter no.434-40/UAUGC/Ay./2025-26 dated 03.06.2025.
- 4) Accordingly, the submitted clarification and the assessment report was once again carefully examined in terms of concerned Acts & Regulations under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and after verification observation is as under:-
 - 1. Teaching Staff:-
 - a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course after clarification remain the same:- $\frac{Available}{Required} \times 100\% = \frac{26}{20} \times 100\% = 86.66\%$ (Excluding Excess)

Application along with document to continue post graduate programme in Shalakya Tantra either with Shalakya- Netra Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) or Shalakya-Karna, Naasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino-Laryngology) or continue with both programs from the academic session 2025 26:

Govt. Gurukul Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Gurukul Kangarl, Haridwar-U.K wants to continue Post graduate programme in shalakya Tantra with both programs (i.e. Shalakya- Netra Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) and Shalakya-Karna, Nasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino-Laryngology) from the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020. **(02 seats - opted 1 seats for each)**

- 5) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been once again carefully reexamined in terms concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was once again placed in the 128th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 24.06.2025 and Board concluded that the college is fulfilling the criteria for issuance of permission in PG Course and not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission in UG (BAMS) Course as per the Concerned Acts and regulations. However, Board decided to issue yearly permission in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations, 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2025-26.
 - a) As per the seat reduction policy 2025-26:-
 - i) Teaching staff:-

"For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 05% of total intake capacity".

All the colleges shall fulfill the requirement of teaching staff as mentioned in Schedule IV of MESAR 2024 and the availability of teaching staff for 60 and 100 intake capacity shall be 100% as the provision of conditional permission mentioned in the Regulation 3(3) of MSR-2016 is not available in the MESAR-2024. However, as per the revised policy letter issued on 20.01.2025, "The 10% Relaxation in the requirement of the teaching staff may be extended for the Academic year 2025-26. Therefore, the colleges with 60 and 100 intake capacity shall have minimum of 27 and 40 teaching staff respectively fulfilling the requirements of the individual departments separately".

After re-verification of the submitted clarification and the assessment report, college is having only 26 total eligible Teaching faculties.

There is deficiency of 01 total teaching faculty as per the approved revised policy letter dated 20.01.2025 for issuance of yearly Permission under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26. Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2025-2026, for deficiency of one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 05% of total intake capacity. As there is deficiency of 01 teacher, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 05% of total intake capacity. As there is deficiency of 01 teacher, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 05% of total intake capacity (i.e. Reduction of 03 seats).

ii) For Deficiency in Non-Teaching staff seat reduction in intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake capacity as under:-

For deficiency in the Librarian post seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat. As the post is vacant, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat.

For deficiency of the Laboratory Technician post in the Dravyaguna, Roga Nidana and kriya Sharir Department, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat each. As the post is vacant, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 03 seats.

iii) For Deficiency in Hospital staff (excluding group D staff) seat reduction in intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake capacity as under:-

For non –availability of 01 EMO seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat. As the post is vacant against the minimum requirement of 02, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 02 seats.

For non –availability of every 02 RMO/RSO/MO seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat. As the post is vacant against the minimum requirement of 09, as per the intake capacity therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 04 seats.

iv) For every 01% deficiency in Bed Occupancy, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat.

Therefore as per the submitted clarification and the assessment report, college is having 45.15% of Bed Occupancy against the minimum requirement of 50% and there is **deficiency of 4.85%**. Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2025-26, 04 seats are reduced from total intake capacity.

v) For Instruments:-

"For every 10% deficiency in instruments, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat."

Availability of Mean of general and essential equipment's/instruments is **75.82%** against the minimum requirement of 100% and there is **deficiency of 24.18%**. Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2025-26 seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 02 seats."

6) Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2025-26 for Teaching staff, <u>Non-Teaching staff</u> hospital staff, Bed Occupancy & instruments under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of yearly permission with 41 seats (51 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course and 12 seats (15 Seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely-(i) Panchakarma-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (ii) Kayachikitsa-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (iii) Shalya Tantra-02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Shalakya Tantra-02 seats(without EWS)(Opted for Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa 01 seats and Shalakya-Karna, Nasa, and Mukha Roga Chikitsa-01 seats, (v) Kaumarbhritya-02 seats (Without EWS) for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

"DECISION"

- 7) Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above Yearly Permission is hereby granted to Govt. Gurukul Ayurved College, Gurukul Kangari, Haridwar-249404, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0239) in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 with 41 seats (51 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course and 12 seats (15 Seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely-(i) Panchakarma-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (ii) Kayachikitsa-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (iii) Shalya Tantra-02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Shalakya Tantra-02 seats(without EWS)(Opted for Shalakya Netra Roga Chikitsa 01 seats and Shalakya Karna, Nasa, and Mukha Roga Chikitsa- 01 seats, (v) Kaumarbhritya-02 seats (Without EWS) in accordance with Regulation 15 (7) of MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024 for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-
 - I. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 41 seats (51 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] and 12 seats (15 Seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 9) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.

- 10) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 11) The aforementioned shortcomings and following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the permission for the academic session 2026-2027:
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
 - v) The remaining shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 4, shall be fulfilled.
 - vi) The remaining visitation Fee as communicated in the letter 28.01.2025.
- 12) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
